Missionary Rendezvous

Eleven nations were represented at last year's PTP. Missionaries are now making PTP a part of their support trips and furloughs. Elders and church members invite their missionary families to join them at PTP and pay their way to come where they meet with a larger gathering of saints than most have ever seen on the mission field. They hear soul-stirring messages to recharge their batteries and extend their mission service.

This year the expanded track has 30 sessions over seven days.

Meet and Greet

There is a meet and greet for churches looking for preachers or preachers looking for churches. Bring resumes and job descriptions to the Concourse Room at 4:30 p.m. on Monday.

The panel on drug addiction has a meet and greet to provide an opportunity to speak with the members of the panel.

There are meet and greets for adoptive families and "find my mission field."

Mentors

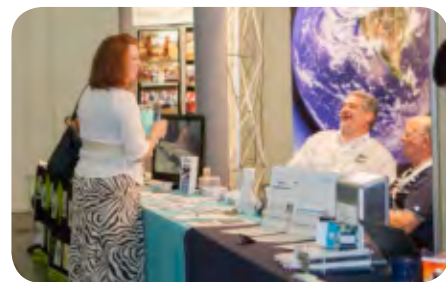
One exciting thing about PTP is the chance to meet one-on-one with well-known preachers, missionaries, and writers of the brotherhood, and to meet with others who struggle with the same issues as you.

There are many opportunities to benefit from the experience of others.

New Panels! There are panels on how to set up an effective visitation program, evangelism, where do I find a mate, questions about baptism, and pain/grief.

Graybeards' Forum: The immensely popular Graybeards' Forum has been expanded. This session features preachers who are 60 and over giving life advice from their vast experience and study. It's always the last day of PTP.

Homeschool: Get together at the homeschool huddle to exchange ideas, attend a panel, or listen to advice from those who have been through it.



CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Receive a PTP certificate by attending PTP classes! Successful participation for five years (32 hours of instruction per year) in the certificate program qualifies you for the PTP diploma. There is no additional charge.

Join us Wednesday at 6:45 p.m. to honor our graduates.

The Process:

Step 1: Choose your track.

Step 2: Sign up for the program by picking up your Certificate Form from Kelli Sewell at the PTP registration table.

Step 3: Attend 20 classes from a single track and 12 elective classes and mark them on the certificate form. (The class number corresponds to the class session in the schedule.)

Step 4: At the end of PTP, return your certificate form and signed honor code with the list of the classes you attended and a statement that your notes are assembled in proper order. (You do not turn in your notebook.)

Step 5: Your certificate will be signed and mailed to you after PTP.

Cancellations

Refunds available if cancelled by August 1 (minus \$25 cancellation fee). After August 1 there are no refunds, but you may use the amount to purchase audios or apply it to PTP 2019.

We do not want anyone who needs a recharge to miss PTP because we charge for it. Some of the more discouraging works may be the very churches that cannot afford to send someone, so we've worked it out so one can come anyway.

First, attend a PTP Spark. Find a Spark close to you. There is no charge for attending Spark (see page 53).

Second, come on Wednesday, August 22, to enjoy the last two days of PTP (a total of 115 class selections) free!

Why Charge Tuition at All?

From the beginning, the preachers who put PTP together expressed a desire to the Jacksonville elders to help bear the cost of what was benefiting their local works. It has always been a cooperative work.

PTP differs from a revival or evangelistic service in that it is a cooperative work of many congregations in educating and edifying their leaders, teachers, and members.

PTP is a workshop—a type of school. Its purpose is continuing education for preachers, elders, and other kingdom workers. Some churches establish

schools to train preachers, and then other congregations send their young men to study in those schools. They assist the overseeing congregation with the finances required to run the school.

This is what churches do with PTP. The Jacksonville church of Christ oversees the work, and other churches and individuals help bear the expense by covering the cost of sending their preachers, elders, and other members. If it is good to send a young man to a school for two or four years to begin his education, then it makes sense to send him a year later to PTP to continue his education.

Splitting the cost equally among those attending is also fair. The fee pays for the materials participants receive during the week (schedules, books, handouts, etc.), promotional costs, some of the meal costs and child care, equipment

rental and conference space costs, and speakers' lodging and travel expenses.

No church or director makes anything from PTP. In fact, the overseeing church, hosting churches, directors, and many individuals sacrifice a great deal to make up the shortfall each year.

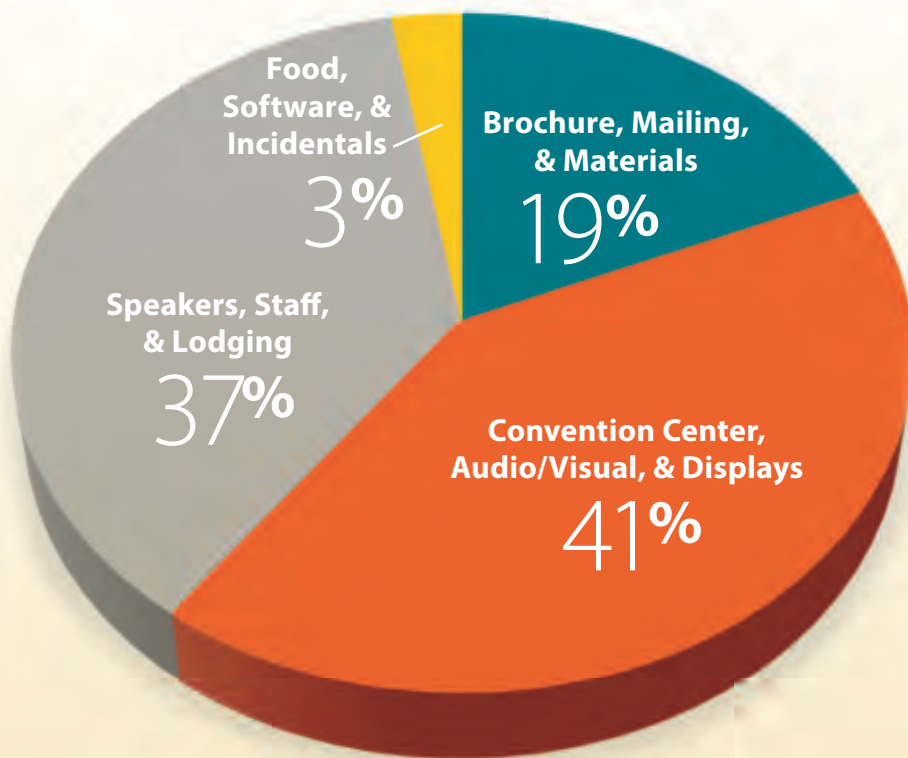
We rejoice that this cooperation enables the brotherhood to have an event that otherwise would not be possible.

An idea! Elders and members rent a large cabin for their congregation. They stay together for the week attending PTP. They buy groceries and cook together. The church pays for this. Then they stay over, at their own expense, and attend a show and eat out. Good relationship building and spiritual growth.

FAQS

"Is registration required if I am only coming for one day?" Yes, everyone must register. You can do this when you arrive.

"Is applause appropriate after speeches?" No, but amens are encouraged!

"May I record the sessions?" Yes, from your seat. You may not put anything on the stage. Also, no cords are allowed in the aisles.

"May ladies attend men's sessions?" Yes.

"May men attend ladies' sessions?" No (1 Timothy 2:12–13).

"Must I stay in one track?" No, you can "cross the tracks" and attend the classes that interest you most.

"What about the waterpark at the Wilderness Hotel?" The hotel waterpark will be closed during PTP. All the directors and overseeing elders oppose mixed swimming because of the Bible's teaching on modesty (1 Timothy 2:9), our responsibility to avoid being a stumbling block to others (Romans 14:13), and our need to avoid putting ourselves into the path of temptation (Matthew 5:28; 6:13).

"It's too cold in the classrooms." It is hard to maintain a constant temperature in a big facility. The result is that it either gets too cold or too hot. Too cold is preferable, given our dress code (we can always bring a sweater or jacket).

"What is the usual dress for sessions?" Dress/casual. Most men wear ties or pullover shirts. Ladies wear dresses or pant suits. Suits and dresses are usual for worship services. The elders request conservative modesty rules be observed: no skirts above the knee, no shorts or tight clothing, no tops that show cleavage. These rules apply to both male and female. Teens arriving at any teen event not dressed appropriately will be asked to change. Those 5-years-old and up must adhere to the dress code.

"Why don't you sell CDs anymore?" We do. The USB drives allow us to replace much of our on-site equipment, but you can place an order for individual CDs and whole sets. Order forms will be available at polishingthepulpit.com and at the PTP registration table.

"How do I order DVDs?" DVDs of previous year's PTP lessons can be ordered from Sain Video Productions at sainpublications.com/shop/.

"The classrooms are too small. I couldn't get in one session I really wanted." We thought about knocking out the walls to make them bigger, but the Convention Center frowned on it. What can we say? It is what it is. We try to put the most popular subjects and speakers in larger venues, but just about everybody on the program is an outstanding presenter, so we run out of large rooms. If there is someone you really want to hear in a smaller classroom, we suggest you get there ten minutes early. Don't expect to come into the class one minute prior and find a seat. Remember, anything that you miss, Lord willing, will be on the USB drive so you can hear it later. Plus, there are other awesome sessions going on in larger rooms at the same time. Roll with it and hear somebody new who may become a new favorite.

"Can I get exhibition space?" Space is very limited. You may fill out a form at polishingthepulpit.com/exhibitors or request one at exhibitors@polishingthepulpit.com.

"Parking?" Yes it is free, and there are a few tricks that can cut down on frustration if you already had the class on patience



last year. First, the side parking lot (beside EHB) has a back exit that gets you right out onto the road. The closer you park to that, the better off you'll be. Also, car pool with people when you can—especially for lunch. If everybody did that, there would be half as many cars leaving. The best kept secret is that you can park in the garage by the hotel for free, which also has a back exit to the road below. Never any waiting there.

“There is a screaming child in my class, and I can't hear what's going on. Don't they know I want to hear?” Parenting is a struggle. We've all been there. PTP has done what we can to help this situation. We have free classes at most times for 2-year-olds and up (who are not in diapers). We have signs asking mothers to take a crying child out immediately. Remind yourself that you are a selfless Christian and that you know parents want to hear, too. It can be tiring and frustrating to be left out of sessions you really wanted to attend. The good news is that there are flash drives available, so everyone gets to hear the lesson later. And the best news is that there's a play area for the younger children. Be thankful they are

rearing their children in the Lord. They are the future church.

“Why don't you have a changing area for special needs children?”

We have a room dedicated as a changing area near EHB. We also have a special needs room in EHB with a dedicated staff. We know that parents of special needs children are probably in need of the benefits of PTP, and we want to improve our service to them. We value your input on how we can improve.

“Will child care and children's classes be available?” Yes, for ages 2 (must be potty-trained) and up. There is no charge.

“May I take my child under 2 into sessions?” Yes. We ask that parents take a child out immediately if he/she cries or makes noise. You will be able to listen to the lesson after PTP on the USB drive.

“Can my child move up a class because his/her birthday is coming up soon?” We have struggled with this. Please understand that there are some big logistical problems when you are working with 800 children. What we do is give parents the option to send their child to either class. That is, if in a transition year, your child is

turning 10 on October 1, he may go to the 9-year-old class or the 10-year-old class.

However, they must go to the class you signed up for when registering them.

We hear all kinds of reasons that a child should move up or down. We cannot make exceptions to keep siblings together or because a child is smart and “belongs” in a higher class. Please respect these rules and understand that they are for the benefit and safety of the children.

“Can my 12-year-old go to teen classes and events?” Only children that will be a teenager in the calendar year 2018 may attend teen events.

“Is Internet access available?”

Note to Parents: This is one of the most popular and fastest growing segments of PTP! We adjust each year to make the teen program better and flow more smoothly. This year we will not sign teens in and out of PTP Teen Late Night. Teens will have different activity options and may go back and forth between them. We will not provide transportation to off-site locations, although the hotel shuttle will run back/forth to the River Lodge Adventure Forest on Monday night. Teens are also free to leave Late Night activities early if parents prefer them back for an earlier bedtime. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure/trust that his/her teen is in the right place and gets back to the hotel safely.

Hike to Grotto Falls: This is a 2.6 miles round trip, rated moderate difficulty. It is a dirt trail not suitable for strollers. It will be approximately a 3-hour trip. We will have an expert at the falls to advise you for best photo opportunities. This is primarily a teen activity, but others may go if interested. Children under 12 may attend with a parent. Cost: Free. Meet in Event Center Lobby at 12:00 PM.

Ober Gatlinburg: \$29/person including tram (normally \$49). Premium wrist band allows each to choose anything on the mountain (chairlift, ice skating, alpine slide, Sky Mountain Coaster, Blue Cyclone Rapids, Lightnin' Water Ride, Shoot-the-Chute, Amaze'N Maze, rock wall, chair swing, Mini Golf, kiddie rides, carousel, wildlife encounter). There is an optional meal voucher for \$7.50. Children under 12 may attend with a parent. Show your PTP Nametag at Ober Skylift to get tickets (must have nametag for discount.) Since we will arrive at different times, do not wait for group to go up and begin enjoying yourself!

Pigeon Forge Community Center:

This facility has three basketball courts, bowling center, racquetball courts, walking track, fitness center, ping-pong, foosball, and a PlayStation. Children under 12 may attend with a parent. Please follow PTP dress code (no shorts, etc.) as it will be enforced. Parents are responsible for getting teens to/from event but can pick up early if they want teens in for earlier bedtime.

Adventure Forest at River Lodge:

Height, weight, and dress restrictions apply. Parents are responsible for getting teens to/from the River Lodge but may utilize the free hotel shuttle. Children under 12 may attend with a parent. Cost: Free. See flyer at registration, the app, or the website for more details.

SevierAir Jump Park: This is Sevierville's newest and largest indoor family adventure park. The facility features 38,000 square feet of advanced and junior Warrior Courses, trampolines, and a first ever 3-story net system for 2–10 year olds. Parents are responsible for getting teens to/from this event. Children under 12 may attend with a parent. Cost: Free.

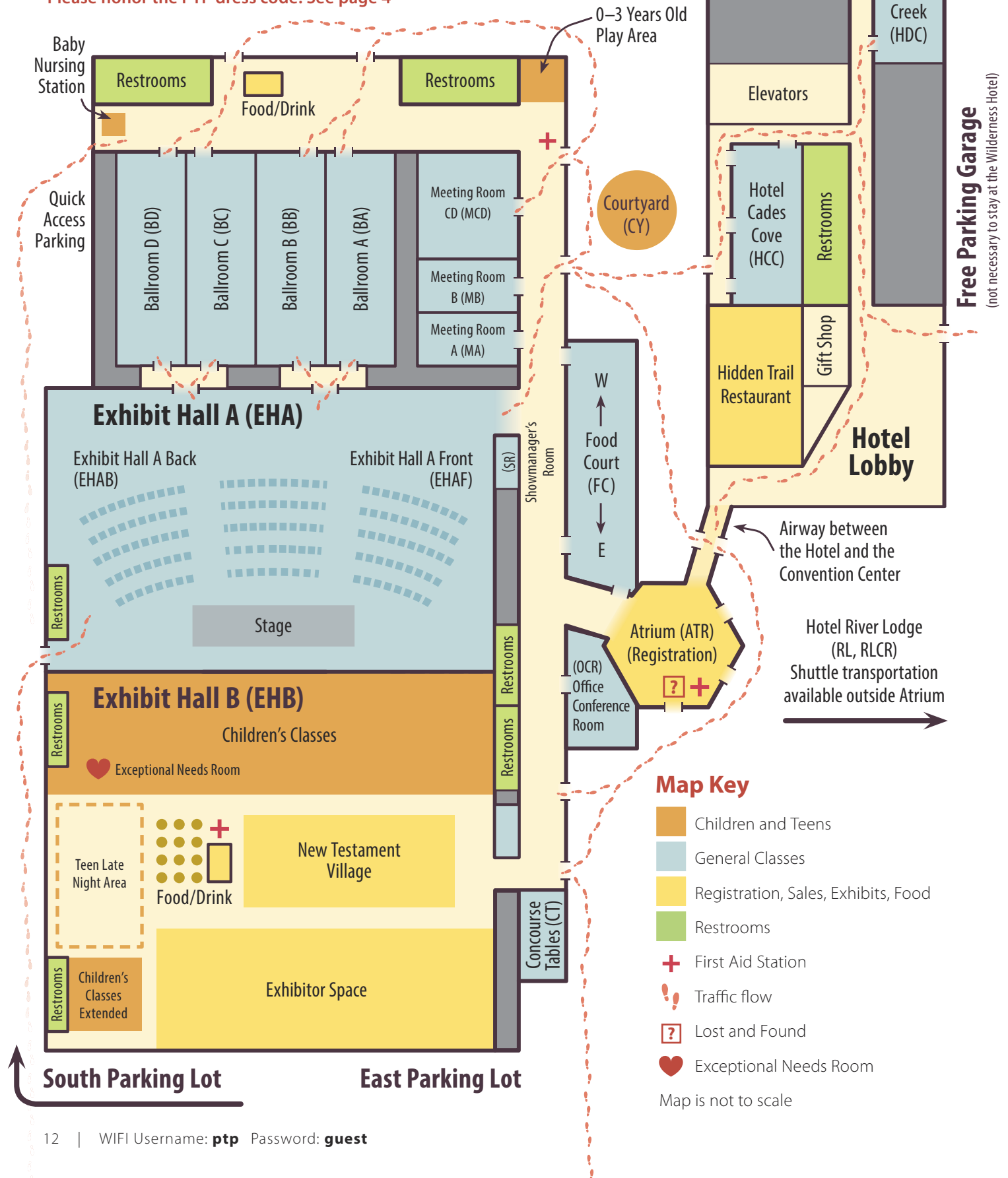

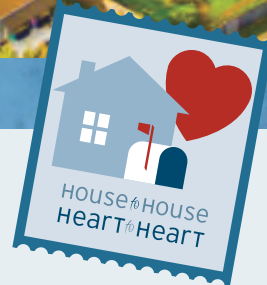

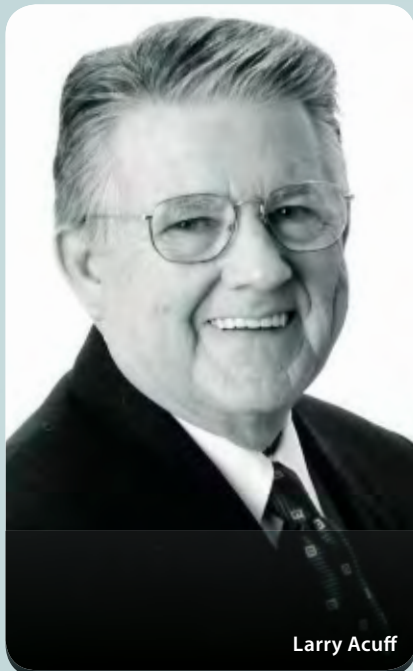
